Response to the recent visit by the Commission on the Future of Policing in Ireland

The Limerick Regeneration Community Consultative Forum has asked me to write to you as a follow up to the recent meetings held in Limerick to discuss the future of Policing in Ireland.

On behalf of those Forum members who attended I would like thank the Commission for providing the opportunity for them to discuss issues with you and I set out below the main points that they raised and formally submit for your consideration.

- Anti-social behaviour by underage children and the seeds of significant criminality in the areas needs to be address through a multi-agency approach
- The Forum believe there should be an increase in Garda resources and a strengthening of the Local Authority's Tenancy Enforcement Team role, through the setting up of a dedicated Unit within Limerick
- There is a reluctance by some residents to report issues as they are unclear of the correct reporting procedure and this could be improved by Community Guards being present and maintaining a relationship within their allotted communities
- The Forum believe that there should be a Limerick-based CAB actively investigating the suspected proceeds of criminal activities in the city and its environs

On behalf of the Forum I would like thank you again for the opportunity to meet with you and to forward on these issues.
